
Economist Impact, supported by Google Workspace, conducted a survey of more than 600 knowledge workers across Asia Pacific about their experiences with hybrid or flexible work.



Percentage of workers with access to remote work




## SMEs more open to hybrid work

**SMEs also expect more time flexibility**




## Flexible work has positive impact on individual well-being




Percentage of respondents working for SMEs claim that flexible work has helped improve employee productivity: **61.8%**
